Disabled bays

Residents with blue badges were finding it difficult to park close to their homes - To date two new disabled bays have been installed on the estate.

Better homes, better neighbourhoods

- Memorial benches and plaques were provided to commemorate the passing of Jonathan Mavunga.
- Railings added on end properties to prevent group gatherings.
- Additional planting at Shurlock to alleviate problems with Ball games.
- Area behind Avard Gardens previously a steep hill has been cleared making way for a pathway with shingle and drainage. Moving forward this will allow the area to be more easily maintained.

Estate walkabout

- Vehicles without valid tax or MOT have been occupying valuable parking spaces. The Housing Officer has been liaising with Bromley Council, to take enforcement action by clamping and removing such vehicles. To date, nine vehicles have been successfully removed.
- All maintenance requests ordered. Residents highlighted areas requiring urgent attention, such as the alley leading to Shurlock Drive, where brambles are protruding from the hedges.

Resident meeting

- Residents commented on increased fly tipping on the estate – residents were encouraged to tell us when they witness a person or persons fly tipping so that in cases where they can be identified they can be charged individually.
- Residents asked for regular updates regarding the development on Darrick Wood – these will be communicated to residents at different stages of the project.
